Course Information

Overview

The simple ability to consume food is one most of us take for granted. But for some children, getting adequate nourishment is far from simple. Feeding challenges are common during the NICU course and persist despite resolution or stabilization of other medical issues. Without appropriate treatment, these disorders can have lasting adverse effects on the child and family. This conference will highlight approaches to treating the NICU graduate.

Target Audience

Healthcare providers who care for NICU graduates including primary care providers, developmental pediatricians, neonatologists, gastroenterologists, nurse practitioners, nurses, dietitians, social workers, speech and language pathologists, occupational therapists, psychologists, and community and school therapists.

Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the learner will be able to:

1. Describe an interdisciplinary approach to the management of feeding disorders common in NICU graduates
2. Describe specific interventions to address difficulties typically seen in this population such as nutrition, swallowing, advancement of oral feeding and postural stability
3. Recognize the challenges and obstacles faced by families, caregivers and healthcare providers caring for this population
