Q. Do children today receive too many vaccines?

A. No. Here's why:

An antigen is a protein or complex sugar (polysaccharide) that causes an immune response.

- In 1900, children received 1 vaccine that contained about 200 antigens.
- By the 1980s, children received 7 vaccines that contained more than 3,000 antigens.
- Today, fully vaccinated children are exposed to fewer antigens in vaccines than those immunized 100 years ago. This is because improvements in protein chemistry and vaccine manufacturing have allowed for more purified vaccine formulations.
