		How was the study conducted (double-blind, randomized, placebo-controlled)?				
		Are there other studies that found the same thing, or is this a new finding				
		that has yet to be substantiated?				





4. Do other sources have similar messages?

5. How well is the information presented?

- ☐ Is the information written and produced well?
- \square Is the story grammatically correct? Are words spelled correctly?
- ☐ Is the intended use for the information clear and appropriate?
- ☐ Are the arguments sound or do they have errors in logic?
- ☐ Is the content reviewed and updated regularly? By whom? Can you tell?
- ☐ When was the content published?
